SUMMER THEME CAMPS

Arts and Culture Week

July 5th- July 9th, 2010

During the week, the campers will participate in storytelling, theatre, clowning, arts and crafts, dance and indoor and outdoor activities. The kids will become familiar with local artists that will provide hands on activities including watercolors, sculpting, card making, drawing and cartooning. During the week, we will walk over to the Innisfail historical building to learn about the town's history. At the end of the week, the kids will take part in a field trip to Sunnybrook Farm in Red Deer.

Extremely Wacky Leadership Week

July 12th-July 16th, 2010

The campers will be immersed in learning about how to be a strong and positive leader through fun activities. By the end of the week, the campers will be able to understand appropriate types of leadership; the campers will learn how to experiment, take risks and learn from their mistakes. The kids will get to participate in a field trip to the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame in Red Deer.

Earth or Going Green Week

July 19th-July 23rd, 2010

The campers will participate in "going green" activities throughout week such as creating art work with recycled materials, learning about pollution and recycling, play environmental games, decorate compost bins, and cook some earth friendly recipes. The week will be educational and a roaring good time!

Survivor Week

July 26th-July 30th, 2010

This theme week is going to be a serious adventure for all campers and counselors. The campers will participate in a variety of games, crafts and unique challenges. The campers will be playing in the pool and the outdoor splash park.

Moving and Grooving Week

August 2nd- August 6th, 2010

Throughout the week, the campers will be dancing and singing from activity to activity. The kids will enjoy the themed dances including Hip Hop, 70's Disco, Groovy 60's, Sock Hop 50's and the Roaring 20's. Dances classes and swimming will be some of the funky aspects the kids will enjoy, no previous dance experience is necessary! The campers will be participating in homemade arts and crafts indoors and outdoors as well as participating in a field trip to Markerville Creamery.

Fun, Fitness and Sport Week

August 9th-August 13th, 2010

Throughout the week, the kids will be participating in obstacle courses, hiking, swimming and games, crafts, role playing and other fun fitness activities. All sports will be included such as basketball, volleyball, badminton and soccer. No previous skill is necessary for participation. At the end of the week, the kids will participate in a field trip to the Bowden corn maze.

Outdoor Adventure Week

August 16th- August 20th, 2010

Our campers will have a blast as they spend a week learning the skills needed for surviving outdoors. The camp will cover basic navigation skills, canoeing, climbing, hiking, biking and many other outdoor activities. Outdoor sports and games will also be included in this theme week as well as visiting the local pool and splash park. The kids will learn all about geo-caching which is a GPS based scavenger hunt where they can learn to search for hidden treasures around the town of Innisfail. The kids will get to participate in a field trip activity at Discovery Canyon in Red Deer.

Emergency Services Week

August 23rd- August 27th, 2010

Throughout the week, the campers will get to experience what it is like to be a police officer, ambulance driver, search and rescue volunteer and many other emergency service professionals. The campers will get to practice search and rescue procedures through scavenger hunts and other outdoor activities. At the end of the week, the campers will participate in a field trip to the RCMP dog training center.
